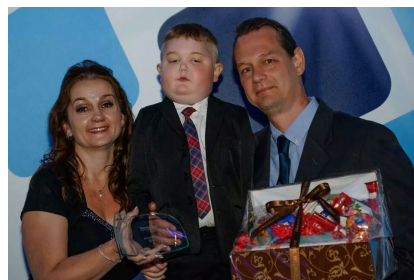

Evacuee Day at Havenstreet Steam Railway.

On Monday year 3 became evacuees and were shipped off on the Steam Train at Wootton Station to their new host families in the country where they were escaping the bombs of WW2. Our journey was interrupted and the army advised us to leave the train as there was a bomb on the line. We disembarked at Havenstreet where the children were able to sample and hear all about rationed food, learn the drill of when the air raid siren went off and were given the opportunity to play with a variety of toys from this period. The children stayed in role all day and looked fabulous in their costumes. Their behaviour was impeccable and they coped extremely well with the intense heat we encountered. It was a very enjoyable day that was had by all.
