Dear Parents and Friends,

Friday 3rd July 2015

Last Friday the Reception children visited Marwell Zoo and had a fantastic day. At the weekend some of you may have visited the County Show. Year 1 had a display of work on that was generated by their visit to Briddlesford Farm earlier in the year. I am very pleased to say they won first prize and have been presented with a cup. The comment from the judge was 'A lovely display which illustrates the knowledge gained by the children, and how the farm visit was used for Literacy Learning. Thank you and well done!' Louisa Face.

On Wednesday, children from Year 6 watched a presentation by the Fire Safety on roadside and car safety. Mr Gregory reported that the children watched the presentation sensibly and were sensitive to the issues raised.

Salad, bread, fresh fruit and water & milk available daily.

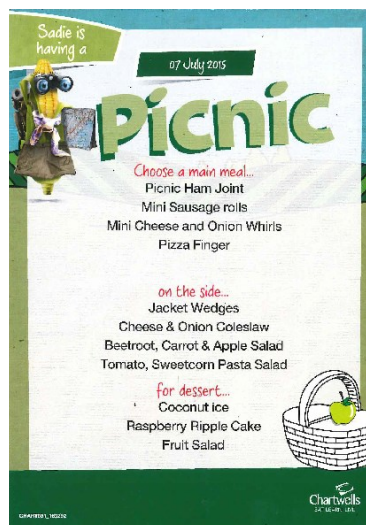
Please note jacket potato and baguette/sandwiches also available. Please order daily by 9am with the kitchen.

Outdoor Fire Safety Messages

Barbecues

Barbecues don't cause too many fires; but that may be due to a history of excellent message promotion by fire and rescue authorities! However, it can also be a way in to talk about cooking fire safety more generally.

Barbecue messages include:



melt the plastic and start a fire.

- Enjoy yourself, but don't drink too much alcohol if you are in charge of the barbecue or any cooking!
- Keep a bucket of water, sand or a garden hose nearby for emergencies.
- Follow the safety instructions provided with disposable barbecues.
- Never use a barbecue indoors.
- Never use petrol or paraffin to start or revive your barbecue; use only recognised lighters or starter fuels on coal.
- Never leave a barbecue or any cooking unattended.
- Make sure your barbecue is well away from sheds, fences, trees, shrubs or garden waste.
- Empty ashes onto bare garden soil, not into dustbins or wheelie bins. If they're hot, they can

Camping

When you are going camping, follow these basic precautions to reduce the risk of fire starting and spreading:

- Never use candles in or near a tent – torches are safer.
- Before you set off, get the contact details of the local fire and rescue service.
- Set up tents at least six metres apart and away from parked cars.
- Make sure you know what the fire arrangements on the camp site are and where the nearest telephone is.
- Don't smoke inside a tent.
- Place your cooking area well away from the tent.
- Keep your cooking area clear of items that catch fire easily ('flammable' items), including long, dry grass.
- Put cooking appliances in a place where they can't easily be knocked over.
- Keep matches, lighters, flammable liquids and gas cylinders out of the reach of children.
- Have an escape plan and be prepared to cut your way out of your tent if there is a fire.
